

HOUSEHOLD WASTE DISPOSAL AND RECYCLING IN CASTLE VALLEY

Castle Valley located in Grand County is served by the Solid Waste Special Service District #1--DBA **Canyonlands Solid Waste Authority (CSWA)**. More information for disposal of household waste and/or recycling can be found at <https://swssd1.org> OR 435 259-6314.

GARBAGE/TRASH/RUBBISH aka Waste:

Subscribe to CSWA for weekly pickup service **OR** take your household trash directly to the CSWA transfer station located at 2295 S. Hwy. #191. Fees apply.

Moab Landfill on Sand Flats Road accepts construction/demolition debris, clean yard waste, scrap steel and tires.

RECYCLING:

There are two options for recycling:

- 1) CSWA accepts source-separated recyclables at the Community Recycle Center (CRC) at 100 East Sand Flats Rd. There is no charge for household quantities (less than 1 cubic yard) but donations are welcome and accepted. There is a secure, on-site donation box near bins. - 2) CSWA single-stream recycle program accepts recyclables at CSWA transfer station located at 2295 S. Hwy#191 **OR** subscribe to bi-weekly pick-up service. Fees apply.

What is source-separated and single-stream recycling?

Two methods of recycling are available. Individuals bring **Source-separated recycling** to the Community Recycle Center (CRC) at 100 E. Sand Flats Rd. The recyclables must be separated by each type (see below). You can save time if you pre-sort and lightly rinse items at home before dropping by the recycle center. Bins are clearly marked and friendly personnel are on-site to answer questions and assist with learning how to recycle properly.

The second option to recycle is **single-stream recycling**. The items remain the same as in source-separated, but they are managed in a different manner. Rather than separate items by each type, all items go in one bin provided by CSWA. Contact CSWA for bi-weekly pick-up **OR** drop recyclables at CSWA Transfer station. Fees apply.

What is recycled?

The items mentioned here can be recycled in either method. This list is not conclusive, but indicates items that can be recycled: #1 & #2 plastic threaded bottles (soda & H2O bottles and liquid dish & laundry soap, peanut butter jars, etc.), steel/metal food cans, aluminum cans, newsprint, office paper & computer paper, mixed paper (magazines, junk mail, etc.), paperboard (cereal & pasta & beer boxes, etc.), glass bottles (beer & wine bottles and glass jars (jelly, cooking oil/pickle jars etc.) and cardboard boxes. Cardboard boxes must be flattened. Books are recycled at CRC.

Regardless of which recycling method you choose, you are responsible for lightly rinsing your recyclables and keep them loose (no plastic bags). Remove lids of bottles and jars. Metal lids go in metals bin. Flatten cardboard.

OTHER WASTE MATERIALS HANDLING OPTIONS

Electronic & Universal Waste Recycling is offered by CSWA every Saturday morning at the CRC. Saturday hours are from 8 AM—1 PM. The list is not conclusive but represents some of the items that can be recycled: computers, TV's, etc. compact fluorescent (CFL) light bulbs, batteries, antifreeze, and smoke detectors. Fees apply.

Household Hazardous Waste Disposal is offered by CSWA once a year at the CRC. Items accepted include solvents, paint, cleaning chemicals, auto batteries, etc. Learn more here: <https://swssd1.org/events/>
